Member Highlight - Kerstyn O'Brien



I am a PA and Clinical Instructor in the Department of Medicine, Division of Pulmonary, Critical Care, Hyperbaric and Sleep Medicine at Loma Linda University Health in Loma Linda, CA.

How long have you been an APP?

I graduated from Rochester Institute of Technology's PA program in 2021. After graduation I moved across the

country from Upstate NY to Fresno, CA to start my first APP job. I was fortunate to work with UCSF Fresno's Pulmonary and Critical Care team, primarily in IP, trach and vent management and some MICU. After around a year of working in Fresno I was fortunate to find my current position at Loma Linda. I've been at LLU for almost two and a half years now!

I've been a member of the AABIP APP and Allied Health Chapter for the past 3 years and have become more involved since attending my first AABIP conference in 2023. Our chapter leadership has helped me grow in my career, gain confidence in my clinical skills and provided support and camaraderie in navigating the challenges of working as an APP.

What is your role in IP?

My role is a bit unique in that I support both IP and hyperbaric oxygen (HBO) services in our division. My main focuses in IP are lung nodules and BLVR, although I do see the occasional pleural or airway patient. I'm currently our BLVR coordinator; and see many of the patients undergoing pre-procedure testing as well as post op after valve placement. I enjoy seeing both new nodule consults needing advanced bronchoscopy as well as those undergoing CT surveillance. When I'm not in the clinic, I supervise HBO dives and consults for both emergent inpatients and outpatients receiving therapy.

What do you enjoy about being an APP?

I most enjoy getting to know and educate my patients and their families on their health. We often meet our patients at some of the most stressful times of their lives, whether they're anxiously going through the process of nodule workup or struggling with complications from a known cancer (i.e. malignant pleural effusion, airway obstruction). As an APP I'm fortunate to be able to advocate for my patients' needs, collaborate with the rest of the healthcare team and provide them with the best care.

Working in an academic setting has also been a great experience – we have PCCM and Critical Care fellows rotating with our service regularly and engaged in research endeavors. I love learning alongside our fellows and residents; and being a support and resource for them as they're exposed to the field of IP. My supervising physician

has been very supportive in my academic interests and encouraged me to work on research projects in addition to my daily clinical practice.

Hobbies, etc.?

Outside the hospital, I enjoy exploring Southern California and take day trips to San Diego and LA on the weekends. After work you can probably find me spending time with my cat Pip (short for Piperacillin Tazobactam), working on crochet projects and baking. My family lives on the East Coast so we travel back and forth to visit as much as we can!
